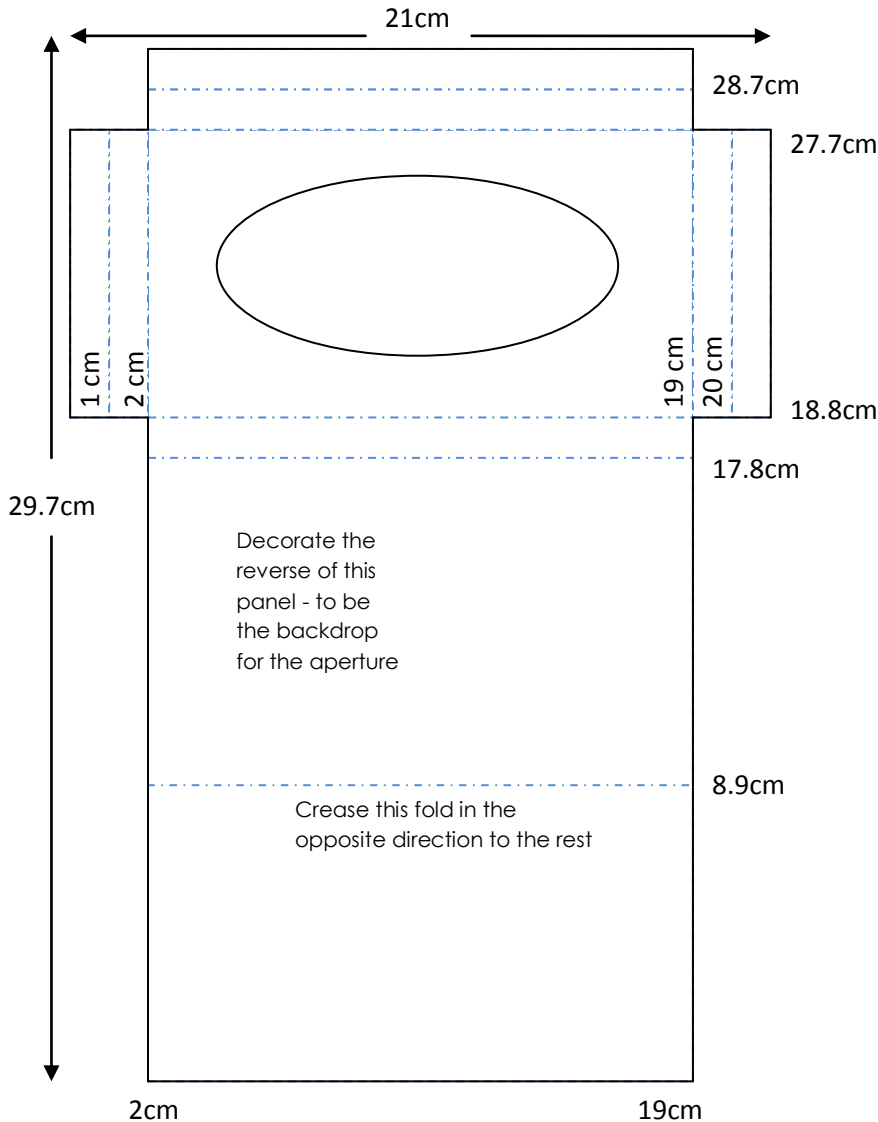


# Box Card Worksheet

Firstly, don't use a heavy weight card for this project, firstly it will be too hard to handle & secondly it will knock out all of the measurements.

And finally..... You will find that the back of the card is slightly longer than the front, this is intentional as I find this helps stabilize the weight of the box front.



## Instructions:

Working with your A4 card in horizontal position measure & faintly mark the following points both top & bottom of your card: 8.9; 17.8; 18.8; 27.7 & 28.7 cm & score all lines.

Turn the card into portrait position to measure & mark the following points both top & bottom of your card: 1; 2; 19 & 20 cm, score in these lines.

Following the diagram to the left, cut away the 2 cm sections you have just scored, to leave only the tabs with which to form your box card.

Cut out your chosen aperture shape in the top panel of the card – indicated here by the large oval shape. Or use the oval template accompanying this worksheet.

Decorate the panel indicated on the diagram to be the backdrop for your aperture.

Decorate around the aperture as desired.

Fold on all of the scored lines, ensuring that the one indicated in the diagram folds in the opposite direction to the rest. Crease well. Using tacky glue, adhere all of the tabs inside of the box section of the card & allow leave to dry out.
