

# Maze Book

(14 pages of fun)!

Resources you will need to complete this project:

1 x 30 cm (12") square double sided card

Selection of 9.5 square images

Pencil, ruler & scissors

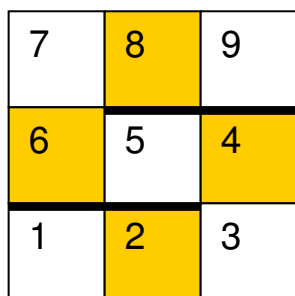
Glue stick, 3D pads & DST (double sided tape)

*Various embellishments:* these could include peel-off stickers, brads, eyelets, charms, ribbons, bows, punched out shapes etc.



How to complete this project:

Measure and make light pencil marks at 10.1 cm (4") intervals around all four sides of your card base. Rather than drawing the lines with your pencil, use a scoring tool (or the side of the blade on a closed pair of scissors), score 2 lines horizontally and two more vertically. With your scissors or craft knife cut only where indicated by the heavy black lines in the diagram below - **you will note that you only cut  $\frac{2}{3}$  of the way along the two horizontal score lines.**



### Folding your maze book:

Starting with square 1, fold right to cover square two, fold left behind square 3, fold upward to cover square 4, fold left behind square 5, fold right to cover square 6, fold upward behind square 7, fold right to cover square 8, finally fold right behind square 9.

There is no definitive inside or outside of this project though one side of your card will produce more book pages than the other, you can easily refold the card if you wish to change these around.

Embellishing the pages is really a matter of personal taste, you could add pockets to insert tags, you could add text, you could cut out apertures, you could add dimension with decoupage or silk/paper flowers. There are no rules, only personal preference.

You can either finish the book off by wrapping a ribbon around it to hold everything secure, or you could make a box, and even attach the book to the lid and the base of the box so that when the box is opened, the maze book will open with it.
