

Paris Nights Collection Fleur

What you will need to re-create this project:

1 x A5 card - mushroom

6.8 x 20.6 cm piece cut from the 30 cm (12 x 12") paper

5 x 7.4cm foiled card - copper

6.9 x 4.7 cm Core'dinations card - cream

Scraps of above

2 x die cut flourishes - cream*

Fine line border peel offs - copper

Butterfly peel off - bright gold

Scrap of copper paper (to mount butterfly onto)

Tacky glue

* You may recognise the flourish as the stamp I created to use in the Golden Halo card.



How to assemble this project:

With the A5 card in portrait position, measure & mark both top & bottom at the central point at approximately 7.4 cm. Score in this line, fold & crease well.

Use an old emery board to 'distress' the Core'dinations card, to reveal the core. Dust thoroughly before mounting onto the copper foil card using an adhesive of your choice. (Do not use a dimensional adhesive).

Making the paper roses from the scraps of Core'dinations card:

With the card face up, tear three small circles of approximately 5 cm from it - tear toward you to have the edges reveal the core. It does not matter how accurate the circle is, in fact the 'wobblier' the better! Follow the step by step pictures to create the rose.



1. The initial torn circle showing the effect on the edges of 'tearing toward you'



2. The circle torn roughly - toward you - in a spiral



3. The core of the flower - showing where to put the tacky glue & the flap of paper you use to secure the core of the flower.



4. The completed flower

Create three flowers as shown above. Attach the paper centrally to the card front using your choice of adhesive & trim the edges with the copper coloured fine peel offs. Affix the matted *Core'dinations* card approximately 3 cm from the top of the card & 1.5cm from the card fold (see main image).

Using tacky glue, group the three roses together near the bottom corner of the *Core'dinations* card panel & use the same glue to attach the two flourishes, one overlapping the side of the main card.

Mount the butterfly onto the copper paper & trim out. Carefully bend the wings to imitate flight & use a 3d pad or gel glue to mount to the top left of the panel.
