

Scalloped Flower Project

What you will need to recreate this project:

- 1 x 14.8 cm square card - black
- 14.5 cm square decorative paper - reds
- 14.5 cm square embossed paper - aged gold
- 6 x assorted paper squares, largest is 11cm - reds
- Button or other for flower centre - gold
- Fine line black pen
- Scalloped layering templates from website



How to assemble this project:

Centre the 14.5 cm square of paper onto the front of your card. Lay the gold embossed paper flat on your work surface & beginning slightly down for the top left hand corner, slowly tear toward you, aiming to end slightly in form the bottom right hand corner. Set aside the remaining half for another project.

Adhere the torn paper to the bottom left of your decorative paper panel. Using the fine line pen, draw faux stitching around the outside border as seen in the photograph.

Print off the layering templates onto the heaviest card your printer allows, & carefully cut out all of the shapes. (You will be left with a template you can use over & over). Play around with your six pieces of assorted papers to decide which order you feel looks the best. Draw the various layers onto the back of your paper pieces & cut out.

Using the fine line pen, go around every shape drawing faux stitching.

Attach the largest flower shape to the centre of the card, then carefully layer up each of the flowers using double sided adhesive foam pads around the centre back of each, slightly altering the orientation to show the petals of the previous layer.

Attach the central decoration.
