

## Tutankhamen Slider

What you will need to create this project:

- 3 x A4 card blanks - black
- 1 x sheet of King Tut images plus icons - available on site
- 1 x A4 hieroglyphics sheet
- 1 x 15 cm square gold foil card
- Border peel offs - gold holographic
- 1 x eyelet - gold (optional)
- Hole punch & eyelet setting tools (optional)
- Decorative corner punch
- Pencil, ruler & scissors
- Glue stick or DST (double sided adhesive tape)
- Silicon glue or 3d pads (double sided adhesive foam pads)



How to assemble this project:

Beginning with the three A4 card blanks. On the first draw a line across with width of the card at 21 cm, forming a natural 21 cm square. Repeat with the second card then measure a 3 cm border in from all sides, and with a pencil faintly draw in the lines. From the score line, measure up to the half way point at 7.5 cm on both sides and score this line. Using a craft knife, cutting mat and metal rule, cut through **three** of the lines and score the fourth. Fold the score lines in opposite directions to form a mountain shape of the card flap you have just cut. At the base of the card below the scored line, make a faint pencil mark at 9.5 & 11.5 cm and make a semi circular cut by drawing around the end of your glue stick between these two points.

On the final A4 card measure, mark and cut a 15cm square from one corner, and a 19 x 14.5 strip from the other. Score a line at 1 cm from the short edge of this strip and fold. Attach this end, using DST to the underside of the loose flap forming the slider mechanism. Cut out a rectangle of 19 x 14.5 cm from the hieroglyphic paper, and using glue stick attach to the upper face of the slider itself so that it will be visible when the slide is pulled out.

Using DST, attach the two main cards together, using DST on only **three** sides, leaving the thumb hole edge unattached ensuring the slider runs freely, attach tape to both inner and outer edges of the frame.

Use the decorative punch on all four corners of the gold foil card.

Cut out the main image and using glue stick, firmly secure the main King Tut mask centrally to the 15 cm square gold foil card, and attach this card to the same size black square card. Turn the work face down and make a faint pencil line across the central axis at 7.5 cm down from the top of the card. Attach DST below this point around all edges. With the mechanism

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slider in the hidden position, attach the image to the slider - the DST should be below the higher scored line. Cut out the second mask minus the necklace adornment. Align this image on top of the main image using 3D pads. Cut out the two icons and position at each side of the mask using more 3D pads.

Make a central mark on the slider through the thumb hole, pull down the mechanism and fold over a thin strip of scrap black card to form the tab, punch a hole where you have marked, put the folded strip behind the hole and punch a hole through both layers, sandwich the slider card between the card strip and attach the eyelet to secure the tab.

Finally, use peel off borders around the outer edge of the frame on the front of the card.

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
